

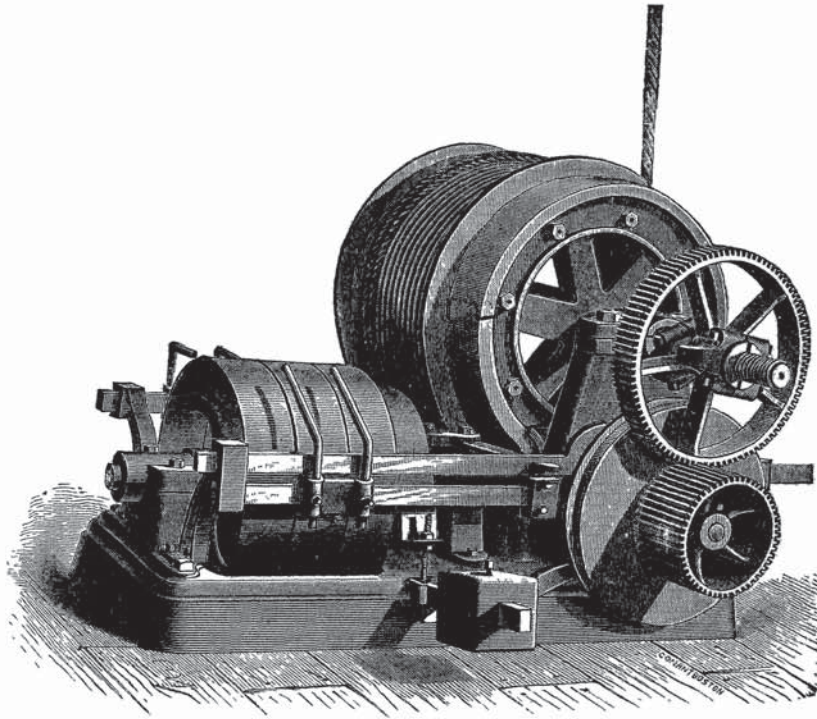

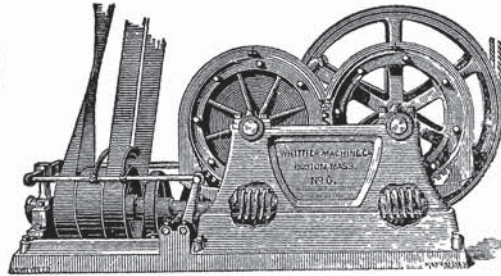

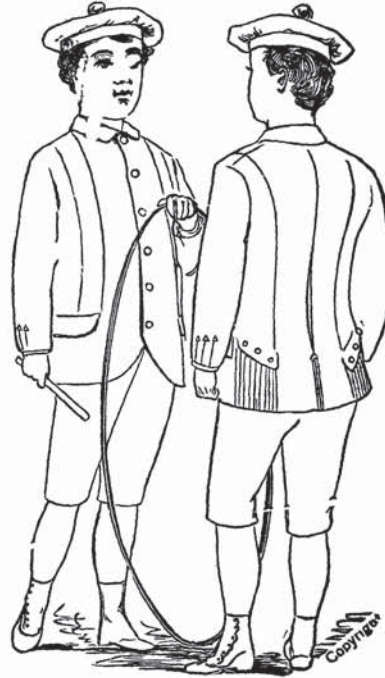

PREFACE.

Thirty-six years ago, in the year 1850, Mr. George Adams, the founder of the publishing house of Adams, Sampson, & Co., now known as Sampson, Murdock, & Co., by arrangement with Mr. Henry Whipple of Salem, prepared a Directory of Salem, and since that time the work has been issued regularly from this office, increasing gradually from a small book of 232 pages, 4 x 6 inches, to the present large volume containing 1,000 pages, representing Salem and the surrounding towns of Peabody, Beverly, Danvers, and Marblehead. Many improvements have been added from time to time, and a new feature in the present number is the plan of giving telephone numbers in connection with the names of all subscribers to the Telephone Exchange. The publishers have labored conscientiously for the best results; particular care has been taken to render all the departments complete and accurate, and while we have aimed to exclude all matter not properly belonging to the Directory, have omitted nothing that these many years of experience have shown to be of practical value.

The statement below will give some idea of the number of alterations that have been made in compiling this volume, and denotes an unusual number of changes in the population and business during the past two years.

Our thanks are due to the public generally for the courtesy and assistance that have been extended to our agents while collecting information, and especially to those who have generously favored us with their patronage; it is gratifying to be able to state that in each of the five places represented in this book the number of our patrons has increased, — this edition of the Salem Directory being the largest ever published.

MASSACHUSETTS STATE OFFICERS—1886.

The State Government consists of a Governor, Lieut.-Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver-General, Auditor of Accounts, Attorney-General, eight Councillors, forty Senators, and a House of Representatives of two hundred and forty members. The annual popular election occurs on the day following the first Monday of November. The plurality system prevails at all elections of civil officers by the people.

Governor—George D. Robinson, of Chicopee. Salary, \$5,000.

Lieut.-Governor—Oliver Ames, of Easton. Salary, \$2,000 and expenses of travel.

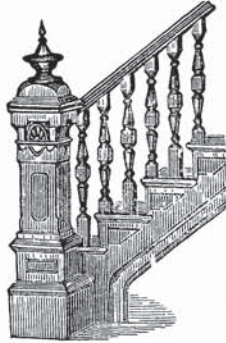

Basis of the System.—1. The unit of length, the *meter*, is the ten millionth part of a quadrant of the meridian of Paris, being 39.37 inches, nearly. 2. The unit of surface, the *are* is the square of ten meters, or a hundred square meters. 3. The unit of capacity, the *liter*, is a cube whose edge is a tenth of a meter. 4. The unit of weight, the *gram*, is the weight of a cube of rain-water, whose edge is an hundredth of a meter. From these four primary units all others are derived according to the decimal scale.

Where used.—The system is adopted by the following countries: in exclusive use in France, Germany, Austria, Belgium, Holland, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Switzerland, Roumania, Brazil; in partial use in Denmark, Greece, Argentine Confederation, Venezuela; legalized, but not in general use in the United States, Great Britain, Russia, Sweden, Norway, Turkey, Mexico, Chili, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Peru, U. S. of Columbia, Uruguay. In Sweden compulsory law will take effect in 1886.

Abbreviations.—For meter, liter, and gram, the small initial letter is used, viz: m, l, g; each division deci, centi, milli, also is abbreviated by using the small initial letters d, c, m.; but each multiple, deka, hecto, kilo, myria, is abbreviated by using the capital initial letter D, H, K, M.

Equivalents.—1 inch equals .0254 meter, or about $2\frac{1}{2}$ centimeters; 1 foot equals .3048 meter, or about 30 centimeters; 1 yard equals .9144 meter, or about 10-11 of a meter; 1 mile equals 1609. meters, or about 16-10 kilometers.

1 U. S. liquid quart equals .946 liter, or a little less than 1 liter; 1 U. S. dry quart equals 1.101 liters; 1 U. S. gallon equals 3.785 liters, or about 3.5-10 liters; 1 U. S. bushel equals 35.24 liters, or about 4-11 of a hectoliter.

1 avoirdupois ounce equals .02835 kilogram, or a little less than 30 grams; 1 Troy or apothecaries ounce equals .03110 kilogram or a little more than 30 grams; 1 avoirdupois pound equals .45359 kilogram, or about 5-11 of a kilogram; 1 long ton—2240 pounds—equals 1016.05 kilograms, or about 1 metric ton.
