## P R E F A C E

In presenting this twenty-second edition of the Naumkeag Directory to the public, the publishers wish to call attention to one thing in particular, that is, that the City of Salem, suffering the great conflagration of June 25th, has rendered it very difficult to obtain information in regard to persons and business firms in the burned district, and has delayed the publication of this book. The undersigned, however, have spared no expense in getting the best information possible, at the time of going to press, for this third of Salem's population, and have starred each name in burned district and have inserted in front of book a supplement showing, as far as possible, names of people who have moved to the various towns in this locality.


All the many other features are continued in the directory, up-to-date as usual.

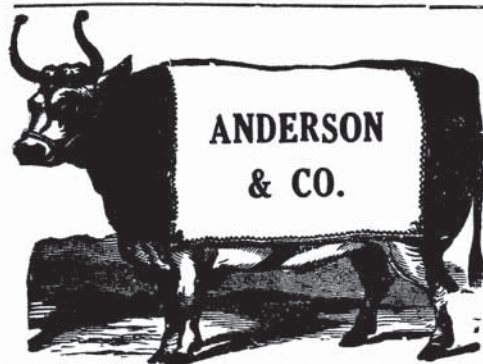
The map shows the burned district, and the table below will be found of great interest.

Adopted June 23, 1914 at the Convention of American Directory Publishers held at Toronto, Canada, in conjunction with the Convention of The Associated Advertising Clubs of the World.

The Publisher of a directory should dedicate his best efforts to the cause of business and Social Service, and to this end pledge himself:

1. To consider, first, the interests of the user of the book.
2. To subscribe to and work for truth, honesty and accuracy in all departments.
3. To avoid confusing duplication of listings, endeavoring to classify every concern under the one heading that best describes it, and to treat additional listings as advertising, to be charged for at regular rates.
4. To increase public Knowledge of what directories contain. to study public needs, and so far as possible make directories supply them; to revise methods and classifications so that what is wanted may be most easily found, and the Directory be made to serve its fullest use as a business and social reference book and director of Buyer to Seller.
5. To decline any advertisement which has a tendency to mislead, or which does not conform to business integrity.
6. To solicit subscriptions and advertising solely upon the merits of the publication.
7. To avoid misrepresentation by Statement or inference regarding circulation; placing the test of reference publicity upon its accessibility to seekers rather than on number of copies sold.
8. To co-operate with all organizations and individuals engaged in creative advertising work.
9. To avoid unfair competition.
10. To determine what is the highest and largest function of the field which he serves, and then to strive in every legitimate way to promote that function.

**STATE NORMAL SCHOOL.**

This school was opened Sept. 12, 1854. It was the fourth normal school established by the State of Massachusetts, and is one of the oldest in the country. Richard Edwards, L. L. D., was principal three years; Prof. Alpheus Crosby, eight years; Daniel B. Hagar, Ph. D., thirty-one years; Walter P. Beckwith, Ph. D., ten years. The present principal began service January 30, 1906. The regular course of study occupies two years. Students who expect to teach in the upper grades of the grammar school will receive preparation, and may elect a third year of advanced work, including observation and practice in these higher grades. A diploma is given when any course is satisfactorily completed. Course for commercial teachers, three years. Advanced courses of one and two years are offered for graduates of colleges and normal schools, and teachers of experience. Tuition and text books are free to residents of Massachusetts. Pecuniary aid is given to needy pupils. The Normal School building, cor. Broad and Summer streets was dedicated Sept. 14, 1854, and was remodeled in 1871. The fine new school building at the corner of Lafayette street and Loring avenue was dedicated Jan. 26, 1897.
