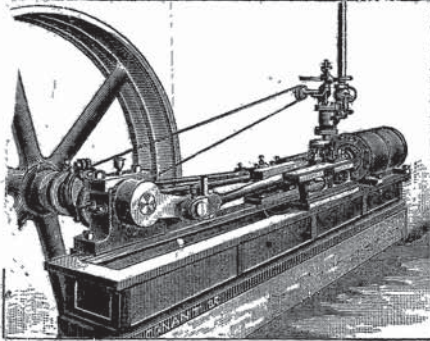

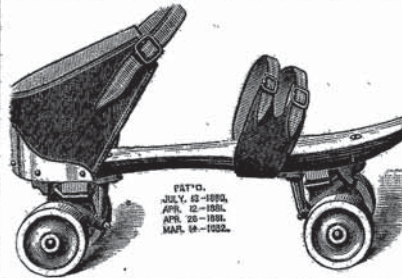

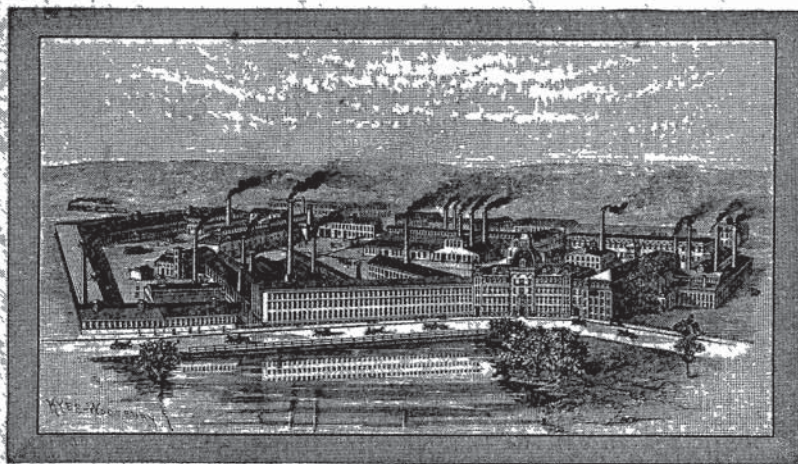

## PREFACE.

---

IN issuing the twenty-first volume of the SALEM DIRECTORY, a few words, calling attention to its varied features, seem appropriate. A noticeable feature of the present Directory is the increase in size of the pages, and also in their number, the large number of names rendering this enlargement necessary; for the sake of compactness, somewhat thinner paper has been used than heretofore, yet the work actually contains nearly one hundred pages more than the last one, issued in 1882. The number of names in each department may be found at the bottom of this page. A most thorough canvass has been made by reliable and experienced men, no one having been employed in any department of the work who has not been proved well fitted therefor by previous experience. Every building within the limits of the city of Salem has been visited, as well as those throughout the towns of Beverly, Peabody, Danvers and Marblehead, but no attempt has been made to swell the number of names by inserting duplicates, or the names of those under the proper age.

The map has been thoroughly corrected, and many new streets added, particularly in the Peabody section. For accuracy, clearness, and beauty, our map has been pronounced by good judges to be the best one ever issued here. This map will be sent by mail to any address on receipt of twenty-five cents by the publishers.

The improved STREET DIRECTORY, and other important features of previous editions have been retained. The plan of giving the names of deceased citizens, with date of death, and of some who have removed, is continued. For other valuable features attention is directed to the comprehensive Index to Contents.

### MASSACHUSETTS STATE OFFICERS—1884.

The State Government consists of a Governor, Lieut.-Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver-General, Auditor of Accounts, Attorney-General, eight Councillors, forty Senators, and a House of Representatives of two hundred and forty members. The annual popular election occurs on the day following the first Monday of November. The plurality system prevails at all elections of civil officers by the people.

*Governor*—George D. Robinson, of Chicopee. Salary, \$4,000.

*Lieut.-Governor*—Oliver Ames, of Easton. Salary, \$2,000 and expenses of travel.

*Executive Council*—Jonathan Bourne of New Bedford, Nathaniel Wales of Stoughton, Charles K. McLean of Boston, Patrick Maguire of Boston, Robert Tarr of Gloucester, Charles S. Lilley of Lowell, Eben A. Hall of Greenfield, Zenas Crane, jr., of Dalton. Salary, \$800 and expenses of travel.

*Secretary of State*—Henry B. Peirce, of Abington. Salary, \$2,500.

*Treasurer and Receiver-General*—Daniel A. Gleason, of Medford. Salary, \$4,000.

*Auditor*—Charles R. Ladd, of Springfield. Salary, \$2,500.

*Attorney-General*—Edgar J. Sherman, of Lawrence. Salary, \$4,000.

**Basis of the System.**—1. The unit of length, the *meter*, is the ten millionth part of a quadrant of the meridian of Paris, being 39.37 inches, nearly. 2. The unit of surface, the *are* is the square of ten meters, or a hundred square meters. 3. The unit of capacity, the *liter*, is a cube whose edge is a tenth of a meter. 4. The unit of weight, the *gram*, is the weight of a cube of rain-water, whose edge is an hundredth of a meter. From these four primary units all others are derived according to the decimal scale.

**Where used.**—The system is adopted by the following countries: in exclusive use in France, Germany, Austria, Belgium, Holland, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Switzerland, Roumania, Brazil; in partial use in Denmark, Greece, Argentine Confederation, Venezuela, legalized, but not in general use in the United States, Great Britain, Russia, Sweden, Norway, Turkey, Mexico, Chili, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Peru, U. S. of Columbia, Uruguay. In Sweden compulsory law will take effect in 1889.

**Abbreviations.**—For meter, liter, and gram, the small initial letter is used, viz: m. l. g.; each division deci, centi, milli, also is abbreviated by using the small initial letters d. c. m.; but each multiple, deka, hecto, kilo, myria, is abbreviated by using the capital initial letter D. H. K. M.

**Equivalents.**—1 inch equals .0254 meter, or about 2½ centimeters; 1 foot equals .3048 meter, or about 30 centimeters; 1 yard equals .9144 meter, or about 10-11 of a meter; 1 mile equals 1609. meters, or about 16-10 kilometers.

1 U. S. liquid quart equals .946 liter, or a little less than 1 liter; 1 U. S. dry quart equals 1.101 liters; 1 U. S. gallon equals 3.785 liters, or about 38-10 liters; 1 U. S. bushel equals 35.24 liters, or about 4-11 of a hectoliter.

1 avoirdupois ounce equals .02835 kilogram, or a little less than 30 grams; 1 Troy or apothecaries ounce equals .03110 kilogram or a little more than 30 grams; 1 avoirdupois pound equals .45359 kilogram, or about 5-11 of a kilogram; 1 long ton—2240 pounds—equals 1016.05 kilograms, or about 1 metric ton.

## WARD BOUNDARIES.

WARD 1. That portion of the city south of Essex street, east of Washington street, excepting South Salem.

WARD 2. All north of Essex street, east of Washington street.

WARD 3. All west or south of Washington and Essex streets, and eastern side of Highland avenue.

WARD 4. Includes all north of Essex street, west of Washington street (except North Salem), and all west of Highland avenue.

WARD 5. All lying south of South River, and east of Eastern R.R. main line, including South Salem.

WARD 6. All of North Salem.

## HACKNEY CARRIAGE REGULATIONS IN SALEM.

ADOPTED JANUARY 31, 1881.

The price, or rates of fare, to be taken by, or paid to, the owner, driver, or other person having charge of any licensed hackney carriage, except omnibuses and barges, shall be as follows:

**SECTION 1.** For the conveyance, from one place to another, within the limits of that part of the city lying and being within the following described boundaries, viz.: Commencing at the junction of Essex and Webb streets; thence running southerly through Webb street to Salem Harbor; thence westerly by said harbor to Union street bridge; thence easterly and southerly by said harbor to Ocean avenue; thence by Ocean avenue to the track of the Eastern Railroad Co.; thence northerly by said track to Margin street; thence southerly and westerly by Margin street and the Mill Pond to the southern end of Hathorne street; thence westerly by the eastern line of the Great Pastures to Highland avenue; thence by Essex, Boston, Grove, Mason, Barr, School and Orne streets to Walter street; thence through Walter street to the eastern end thereof, and continuing on the same course to the North River; thence westerly by said river to the bridge on North street; thence easterly by the southern line of North River to the northern end of March street; thence by March, Bridge and Osgood streets to Collins Cove; thence westerly by Collins Cove to Webb street; thence southerly through Webb street to the point begun at; of one or more adult passengers, twenty-five cents each.

**SECT. 2.** For one or more adult passengers from any place in the city within said limits to any place in the city beyond said limits, but within Block-House square, the junction of Lafayette street and Lynn road, the glue works on Highland avenue, Prospect, Varney, Rawlins, Watson, Grove, Mason, Myrtle, School and Northend streets, Liberty Hill road, Appleton and Orne streets, and Beverly bridge, or vice versa, thirty-five cents each.

**SECT. 3.** For one or more adult passengers from one extreme to another extreme of the limits described in the second section, fifty cents each.

**SECT. 4.** From Washington street, the depots, or any place in the city east of Washington street, and between North and South Rivers, to the Willows, Juniper or Winter Island, or vice versa, for one adult passenger, seventy-five cents; for two adult passengers, fifty cents each; for three or more adult passengers, thirty-five cents each. From any place in the city beyond the limits hereinbefore stated in this section, but within Ocean avenue, Boston, Grove, Mason, School and Orne streets, to the Willows, Juniper or Winter Island, or vice versa, for one adult passenger, one dollar; for two or more adult passengers, fifty cents each.

**SECT. 5.** From any place within the limits mentioned in Section 1 to Harmony Grove, for one adult passenger, seventy-five cents; for two adult passengers, fifty cents each; for three or more adult passengers, thirty-five cents each. For returning therefrom with same passengers, and without delay, fifty cents, whether for one or more passengers.

**SECT. 6.** For the conveyance of persons to any place not hereinbefore specified, and for funerals, special reasonable rates may be charged.

**SECT. 7.** The charge for hackney carriages drawn by two horses, when hired by the hour, shall be one dollar and one-half of a dollar for each hour, and when drawn by one horse, one dollar for each hour; and for parts of hours after the first hour, a proportional part of the rate for one hour shall be charged.

**SECT. 8.** For children under six years of age, with an adult, no charge shall be made. For children between six and twelve years of age, when accompanied by an adult, the fare shall be half the price charged for an adult, and when not accompanied by an adult, full fare may be charged.

**SECT. 9.** Between the hours of ten o'clock at night and half past six o'clock in the morning, double the above established rates may be charged.

**SECT. 10.** No charge shall be made for one trunk, and the valise, carpet-bags, portmanteaus, bundles and baskets, of each passenger, but for each additional trunk, more than one, fifteen cents may be charged; and the owner or driver of any hackney carriage shall not be required to take or deposit the baggage of any passenger, except from or in the hall or vestibule of any residence or building in the city.

**SECT. 11.** Where any street is mentioned in this order as the boundary of any limit, both sides of the street shall be deemed to be, and is included, within such limit.
