POST

POSTAL REGULATIONS

First-Class Matter.—Matter which is in written inscription in the nature of a personal correspondence sealed against inspection, are by their nature and character matter, and subject to the postage rate of two cents for each ounce. In this class are included drawings, plans and designs. At all free delivery offices two cents for each ounce or fraction of one cent.

By the affixing of a special ten-cent stamp in addition to the regular postage, the sender will be entitled to immediate delivery between 7 o'clock A. M. and 4 P. M. close of office hours, in any city or town of four thousand or more population. Delivery will be made within the carrier limit of any free delivery office, or within one mile of the post office or other places as designated above.

Second-Class Matter.—Mailable matter of the second-class embraces newspapers, papers, and other periodicals, publications which are issued at stated intervals as frequently as four times a year, and are within certain conditions.

When sent as transient matter, by others than the publishers, one cent for each ounce or fraction thereof.

Third-Class Matter.—Mail matter of the third class embraces books, circulars, and other matter wholly in print. Proof-sheets, corrected proof-sheets, and manuscript copy accompanying the same, must be paid for at the rate of one cent for each two ounces or fractional part thereof; and must be fully prepaid by postage stamps affixed to said matter.

A Circular is defined to be a printed letter which is being sent in identical terms to several persons. It does not lose its character as such by writing the name of the addressee or sender therein, nor by the correction of mere typographical error in writing.

Fourth-Class Matter.—Mailable matter of the fourth-class embraces labels, patterns, playing cards, visiting cards, address tags, paper sacks, wrapping paper, and blotting pads with or without printed advertisements thereon, bill-heads, letter-heads, envelopes with printed addresses thereon, ornamented paper and all other matter of the same general character, the printing upon which is not designed to instruct, amuse, cultivate the mind or taste, or impart general information. This class also includes merchandise and samples of merchandise, models, samples of ores, metals, minerals, seeds, etc., and any other matter not included in the first, second or third classes, and which is not in its form and nature liable to destroy, deface, or otherwise damage the contents of the mail-bag, or harm the person. Postage rate thereon, one cent for each ounce or fractional part thereof.

The postage to Canada is the same as domestic postage, except on merchandise, which is ten cents for eight ounces or less.

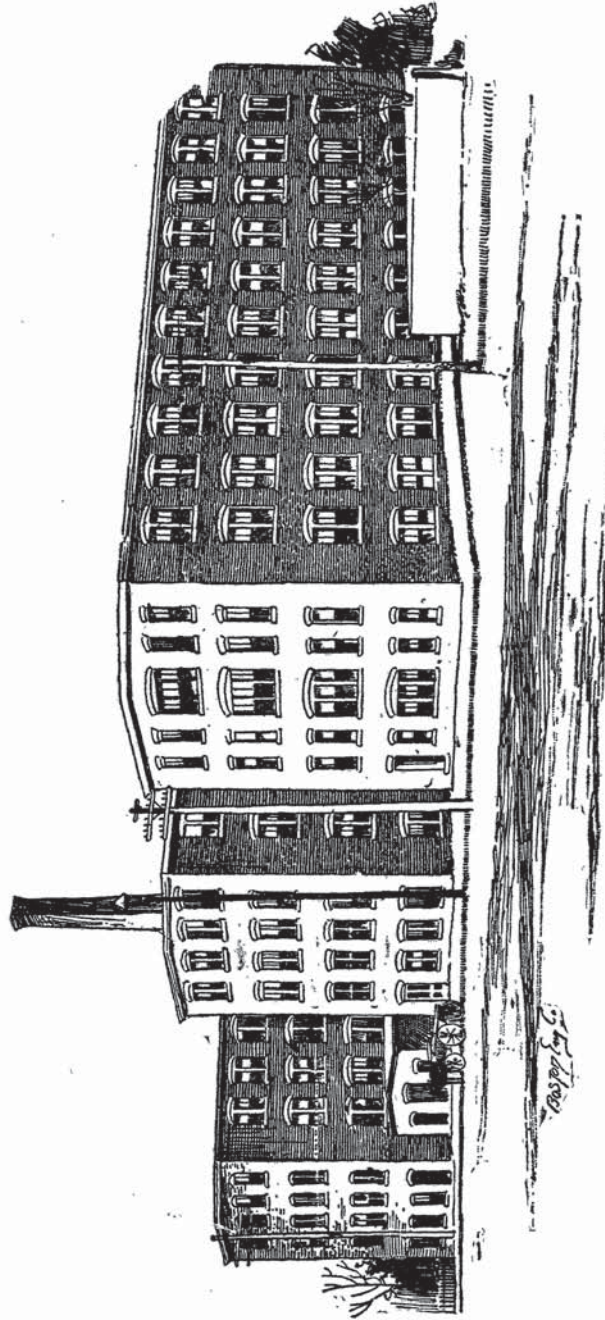
The rates of domestic money orders are as follows:—On orders not exceeding \$10, 8 cents; over \$10, and not exceeding \$15, 10 cents; over \$15, and not exceeding \$30, 15 cents; over \$30, and not exceeding \$40, 20 cents; over \$40, and not exceeding \$50, 25 cents; over \$50, and not exceeding \$60, 30 cents; over \$60, and not exceeding \$70, 35 cents; over \$70, and not exceeding \$80, 40 cents; over \$80, and not exceeding \$100, 45 cents.

The fee on any registered matter, domestic or foreign, is fixed at ten cents on each letter or parcel, to be affixed in stamps in addition to the postage. Two or more letters or parcels addressed to or intended for the same person, cannot be tied or otherwise fastened together and registered as one.

Postal Notes.—The uniform fee for the issue of a Postal Note is three cents. A Postal Note may be issued for any sum from one cent to four dollars and ninety-nine cents, but not for any sum including a fraction of a cent. The name of the postmaster must be written and not printed. No written application for a Postal Note is required. There is no limit to the number of Postal Notes that may be issued from the same office on the same day to the same person. A Postal Note is valid until three months from the last day of the month of issue. The Postal Note is made payable to bearer, and hence to whomsoever presents it. If a Postal Note be lost or destroyed, no duplicate can be issued; but duplicate of an invalid note (one not paid within the given time) can be procured.
