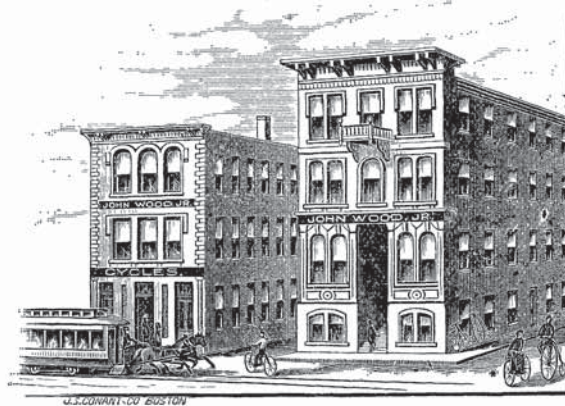

BEVERLY BUSINESS DIRECTORY.
