One blow, more hose is needed.
Two blows, fire is out.
Four blows, Steamer is wanted.
Five blows, call for veteran firemen.
General alarm, One round from same box.
School signals, 2-2-2-2 at 7.30 A. M., and 1.15 P. M., no session of the schools.
5-5, call for help from out of town.

Directions for Sending in an Alarm.

Upon the discovery of a fire, go to the box nearest to the fire, open the door, and **pull down** the slide or hook **once only** and **let go**, and if possible remain at the box until the arrival of the firemen.

Never signal for a fire seen at a distance.

Second Alarms for the same fire are to be given only by one of the engineers.
