DIRECTIONS FOR SENDING IN AN ALARM.

Upon the discovery of a fire, go to the box nearest to the fire, open the door, and pull down the slide or hook once only and let go, and if possible remain at the box until the arrival of the firemen.

Never signal for a fire seen at a distance.

Second alarms for the same fire are to be given only by one of the engineers.
